Production at U.S. Wineries Increases 6% in 2012

Our ongoing research with U.S. wineries allows us to track production levels for each winery. We're seeing production growth generated by new winery openings along with increased volume at existing wineries. In addition to annual cases produced, the WinesVinesDATA winery database captures average bottle price (ABP) for wineries. Extending ABP to winery production level, we are able to calculate a weighted average bottle price for county, region or state.

Confirming our production figures, the year-end TTB 2012 Statistical Report on Wine shows that the volume of still and sparkling wine produced increased 6% to 327 million cases for 2012.



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
